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1. Message from your President

Meetings

In the second half of this year four of our five Federations are holding their biennial conferences. The exception is the North American Federation of Sexology Organisations (NAFSO). Since the resignation of the President in 2010 NAFSO has been quiescent. Currently a number of leaders in North American sexology are working to re-energize the organization. I am confident that, in due course, we shall once again have an active and involved North American Federation.

As you probably know, the first Federation Conference to get under way is the AOFS meeting in Japan in August. This is followed in September by the African Federation Congress, overlapping with the EFS meeting. This has come about as the AFSHR had to re-schedule from a February meeting in Cairo to September in Namibia. The EFS meeting is being held in Madrid and then, in October, FLASSES will be meeting in Colombia. All these meetings are being held in optimum locations and have a very interesting range of speakers and topics. All WAS members are encouraged to attend the Federation Congresses and enjoy learning more about local activities, advances and challenges

and participating in diverse cultural experiences.

Progress toward the achievement of the 21st World Congress of Sexual Health in Rio has been inhibited by the financial crisis. However, Jaque Brendler, SBRASH and the WAS Executive Officers have been working hard to ensure a successful meeting in the carnival city. More detailed information is available in this Newsletter.

The WAS Ethos

I take this opportunity to remind all members that a number of WAS documents are freely available through our web site. Amongst these are the WAS Mission Statement, the Standards of Practice, the Guiding Ethical Principles and the seminal document, Sexual Health for the Millennium. The content of these documents represent the ethos of WAS, emphasizing our strong support for advocating and protecting sexual rights. WAS rejects discrimination based on gender, sexual orientation, physical or intellectual capacity, race, religion or ethnicity. While many of us live in countries where not all these rights are officially protected we urge our member organizations to take an active role in promoting equity and rights. At the very least, member organizations and individuals are

encouraged to exercise non-discriminatory behaviours and attitudes. I have been saddened to hear that at a recent professional meeting there were public acts of gender discrimination by officials. Sometimes these acts are beyond the level of consciousness as they are rooted within our culture. While many cultural traditions are to be respected, those that discriminate on spurious grounds are irrational and not worthy of protection. When our own member organizations are not mindful of discrimination it is difficult for us to encourage positive change outside of WAS. Maybe it is time for reflection and self examination to reveal our prejudices.

Elections 2013

As you are aware, the election of members to the Advisory Committee will be held at the 2013 Congress. The success of WAS is dependent on the work of the members of various committees and the leadership that might be provided. I encourage members to consider standing for election, bearing in mind that the commitment is significant in both time and personal costs. Please refer to the WAS Statutes and By-Laws for the details of the composition of the AC and the Executive Committee.

The Chair of the Council of Presidents, Eusebio Rubio, is convening a meeting of the Council to develop procedures for the election of the President for 2013 – 2017. From the Statutes you will see that the AC elects the President, however, to ensure that the process is fair and open, it was proposed that succession planning should be more systematic. In due course the deliberations of the Council of Presidents will be shared with all members and a call for nominations will be made.

World Sexual Health Day 2012

Plans are well under way for our third annual World Sexual Health Day on 4th September. While this is the designated day, different parts of the world use days, or even weeks, either side of that date. This year's theme is: ***In a diverse world, sexual health for all.*** The emphasis is on encompassing people of all ages, interests, needs and abilities. We aim to

Obituary Dr Sei'ichi Matsumoto

In late 2011 Dr. Sei'ichi Matsumoto passed away at the age of 95.

He was Emeritus Professor of Jichi Medical School and Gunma University in Japan

He was President of the Japan Family Planning Association and a strong advocate for sexual health for all. He was an enthusiastic proponent of sex education for doctors, nurses and midwives.

In 1995 Dr. Sei'ichi Matsumoto was President of the WAS World Congress in Yokohama, where he received the WAS Gold Medal and in 2000 he was President of the Asian Congress of Sexology in 2000 in Kobe.

During the 12th AOFS congress in Matsue, there will be a special memorial lecture to commemorate Dr Matsumoto's outstanding achievements in the fields of sexual medicine, reproductive health and reproductive rights, especially for adolescents .

The Japanese and the international Sexual Health communities lost one of their founding pillars.

Alain Giami, Chair of our WAS Scientific Committee was offered the position of Scientific Director for the Unesco Chair on Sexual Health and Human Rights. Alain decided to take this important responsibility and to hand back the

In January of this year Rosemary Coates, our President, was appointed as **Officer of the Order of Australia (AO)** 'for distinguished service to the community in the field of reproductive and sexual health through executive roles with national and international organisations, and to medical education and research'.

4. News from the Federations

AFSHR

The African Federation of Sexual Health and Rights.

Cairo was preparing to host the 5th AFSHR Conference. However, due to the political situation in Egypt, the meeting was at first postponed to September 2012 and finally moved to Windhoek in Namibia in South-Western Africa.

The Conference will take stock of responses to sexual health and rights on the continent since ICPD, and interrogate the status of sexual health and rights, with particular focus on women, girls, adolescents and youth.

The conference is being hosted by the Namibia Planned Parenthood Association (NAPPA), an affiliate member of the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF) under the auspices of the African Federation for Sexual Health and Rights.

AOFS

Asia Oceania Federation of Sexology is currently urging to promote the existence of such Federation in Asia and Oceania.

Promotion of Sexology, Sexual Health, Aging and Sexual Medicine are in our agenda.

Asia -Oceania has brilliant experts in these fields and we have to speed the realization of this idea. But on the contrary many constrain factors were herein involved that should be overcome in this short future:

MESHHC

Middle East Sexual Health Committee

Although only just started in 2010, chaired by Sara Nasserzadeh, the MESHHC is on its way to become the magnet for professionals working in the field of human sexuality in the region. Through establishing this committee there has been increased participation of colleagues from the Middle East and Muslim countries to the WAS 2011 conference. There was also a very active participation of many Middle East and Muslim countries in celebrating the 2011 World Sexual Health Day.

MESHHC encourages their members to attend the WAS meetings and join the global sexual health community.

Presently MESHHC is connecting with the newly established MESSM (Middle East Society for Sexual Medicine), affiliated to ISSM. Next year in September representatives of MESHHC will participate in the MESSM meeting in Beirut (Lebanon), aiming at expanding their network and building strong connections.

One purpose of the Committee is to shape a regional association, by bringing the current organizations together.

The political developments in the 'Arab Spring' forced many activities within the region to take a detour from the original plans of the Committee. However our various local representatives have

accomplished impressive achievements both at their individual as well as organizational level.

This ranges from publications to charring congresses and supporting national and regional initiatives.

One example is Pakistan, where the current political situation seems to have an adverse effect on the sexual and reproductive health. Since conservatism is on the rise, discussions related to sexuality and sexual health and rights are difficult to initiate in both government and private sectors. Rutgers WPF Pakistan continues to defend and promote sexual and reproductive health and rights in Pakistan by using culturally appropriate and multi-sector strategies, incorporating cultural, religious, social and economic considerations. They published the '*Media handbook; A guide book for journalists of Pakistan*' to provide media professionals with the necessary relevant information regarding sexual and reproductive health and rights.

Rutgers WPF was also active on the regional level. In March this year they organised the 'Muslim Countries Consultation on the Commission on Population and Development'. Civil society representatives participated from eight Middle East and Muslim countries. During that consultative process a Muslim Countries Group on CPD was formed to collaborate more effectively as civil society of the Muslim world.

We found courses in 5 languages (English, Chinese, Spanish, Italian and French) and in addition internet courses in various other languages.

For sure there will be other courses on the globe that I overlooked. So, please take the opportunity to inform us so that we can improve the list. This is one way for WAS 'to close the gap'.

10. Attention for Sexuality Education

Increasing distribution and accessibility of internet create new challenges in the area of sexuality education. Millions of young and older people are looking for proper information, especially in areas with many sexual taboos. WAS could have a guiding task in that area. There are some differences depending on choices students make but the Master's degree total cost is between \$30,000 and \$35,000.

The Ph.D., which includes the MEd coursework plus dissertation supervision, costs about \$60,000 to \$65,000.
